

Sutton Park, Streetly Gate

Final Details



Venue: Sutton Park on the north east side of Birmingham.

The entrance to the Park for this event is via Streetly Gate on the north west side of the Park. This is on Thornhill Road, just south of the bridge over the railway line. Map reference SP 087 984; Postcode B74 3EW will get you very close.

From M6 J7 follow A34 towards Birmingham. After approx. 800 m turn left onto A4041. Follow A4041 for approx.4.7 km to roundabout at A452. Here take second exit into Thornhill Road (B4138). After approx. 1.7 km turn right into Sutton Park at Streetly Gate.

Car Park: Once through Streetly Gate follow the Park road for 1,6 km. You will then be directed left for 250m to park on a flat grassy area close to the assembly and start / changeover / finish

Assembly: will be located adjacent to parking.

Club Tents: are welcome

Enquiries & Registration: will be located at Assembly

Enquiries will have an envelope for club captains to collect. The envelope will contain any additional information and EMIT cards (free of charge) for all runners. Last minute changes will be made at Enquiries and taken to Download prior to the start.

Map issue: will be located at Assembly.

Download: will be located at Assembly.

Facilities: Toilet units will be located near to Assembly

Start times: Mini relay 11:05, all other classes 11:00 – call-up for first leg runners from 10:45am (for the mini-relay, call up will be immediately after the mass start for all other classes). Later a mass start for all those still yet to run will be before 1pm.



Individual gaffles on a course may vary slightly in length / climb but this is evened out over the whole race so each team will run the same total distance/climb

Terrain: Fast and runnable. A mixture of semi-open parkland and forest, with some contour detail in the eastern part.

Trophies: Any unreturned trophies should be brought on the day so they can be presented. Please make sure they have been engraved from last year.

Prize giving: This will be as soon as possible after 1pm. If you are in a winning team, please try and stay to smile in the photos!!

Entries: Via club captains only

Fees: Senior Teams £21, Junior Teams £9,

Punching: EMIT timing system will be used. All runners will be provided with an EMIT Card (free of charge) in their Team Pack. Lost cards will be charged at £55.

First aid: OD First Aider, Melanie Elkington will be on hand. In addition, a first aid kit will be available at the download tent.

A&E:

The nearest A&E (**2.8 miles from Streetly Gate**) is the Good Hope Hospital, Rectory Road, Sutton Coldfield, B75 7RR

Maps showing how to get there from Streetly Gate will be available at enquiries.

Safety:

During the Risk Assessment process the organiser states that upon consideration of the terrain, whistles must be carried by all – these will be checked.

Sutton Park contains several **Lakes** and **Ponds** which have no fencing – competitors on certain courses will be sharing adjacent paths with the public. Please take care.

Be aware of traffic on the Park roads and in car parks

All courses cross the **railway line**. Competitors must not cross the railway other than by using those crossing points (under- or over- bridges) which are overprinted on the map. The connecting lines between controls on either side of the railway may be diverted via particular crossing points, however competitors have free choice to use alternative marked crossing points if they prefer.

Be aware of **wire** from ruined fences in the vicinity of some controls. This is not of the barbed type but constitutes a nasty **trip hazard**. Where particularly close to one control site, the controller has broken the wire and coiled the ends round a round a tree trunk out of the way to mitigate risk of a trip.

Dogs, Ponies and Cattle: Dogs are welcome, but please keep on a lead at all times. The Park is used by many including families; walkers; dog walkers; cyclists; horse riders dog walkers and bike users. Please give others using the Park every courtesy. Please be aware that there will be **ponies** and **cattle** grazing in the area. They are normally docile and used to visitors, but please take care not to disturb them unnecessarily and avoid actions which might spook them or lead them to stampede.
