A WM League (Level C) event at Coombe Abbey Country Park, including Yvette Baker Trophy Heat suitable for everyone from the absolute beginner (help and advice available) to the experienced orienteer.

Location : Coombe Abbey Country Park, Brinklow Road, Binley, Coventry CV3 2AB OS grid reference <u>SP 404790</u> what3words:: car park at <u>///corded.distracts.cases</u> Signed: from Brinklow Road

Car parking: Main public car park located to the right of the main entrance drive. Parking charges apply – 1-2 hours £3.00, 2-4 hours £3.50 – there are 4 pay points, 3 are cashless, 1 in the visitor centre accepts payment by cash and card. <u>Coombe Abbey Park – Coventry City Council</u>

Assembly: at the north end of the car park.

Entry on the Day Registration, Enquiries, Download. Toilets are in the visitor centre – on the exterior of the building. This is on the way to the start. The WMOA Junior Squad will be selling cakes. There is also a café in the visitor centre.

**Start:** 500 m from the edge of the car park **Finish:** 300 m from the car park Walking to the Start will pass the Finish.

## Start times: 10:30 to 12:30 All courses will close at 2:00pm, and control collection will begin immediately.

### Map and Course notes:

All maps are printed at 1:7,500 scale with a 2.5-metre contour interval. Magnetic North: 2022. All maps are printed on waterproof paper.

Separate control description sheets will be available in the Start Box. White and Yellow courses have text control descriptions, all other courses have pictorial control descriptions.

Coombe Abbey has recently been updated in many areas by Bruce Bryant. In a few areas, you may encounter differences in details such as the density of vegetation. The public nature of Coombe Abbey can result in some paths that regularly appear and disappear. Only the most significant paths have been mapped.

Competitors are reminded to check their control codes and descriptions carefully before punching.

The popularity of Coombe Abbey amongst families etc. should result in a low risk from "stranger danger" but parents of juniors running alone should remind them that, if concerned about anyone they encounter on their course, they should abandon their run immediately and run to either the start or finish (whichever is closer), or Go Ape (which is within the park) to seek help.

## **Course Specific Information:**

White course competitors will be assisted in navigating on their course by the placement of happy face and sad face markers. The background colour of these markers is irrelevant. **Happy and sad faces ONLY apply to the White course**.

Green and Blue courses cross one internal park road. This road is an access road to the hotel car park and is lightly used. Care should be taken when crossing the road and competitors should not run on the road.

## Safety Bearing: - if lost head east and ask for directions to the main car park.

Pairs are permitted to compete on the Yellow course, subject to the following:

• They must stay together and cross the finishing line together

• If a pair contains two different ages categories they are treated as though they are in the older age category

• If a pair contains a boy and a girl they are treated as though they are in the boy's category in the age class of the older of the pair

• Neither member of the pair is to have achieved a Gold standard at any of the competitions listed in the section above.

It is expected that clubs will only want to run pairs to enable novices to participate, and that clubs will observe the spirit of this rule. Competitors should be able to run on a course appropriate to their ability rather than just their age.
